CONDITIONS UPON WHICH THIS PERMIT IS ISSUED

- 1. IHT welcomes the use of some of its properties for low impact recreational and educational use. It is the intention of IHT to cooperate with event planners to the fullest extent compatible with its charge to preserve all species of flora and fauna, archeological sites, and all geologic materials in a natural state, and to require compliance with IHT Use Guidelines.
- 2. Special events held on IHT properties require the approval of the IHT Stewardship Committee and the Executive Director of IHT. Approval is based on information supplied in a permit application which includes a description of the special event, and includes a copy of the certificate of liability insurance.
- 3. IHT suggests that the sponsoring organization makes a donation to IHT to offset any costs of event incurred by IHT. IHT requires restitution if extra costs to IHT are incurred resulting from vandalism or destruction of property during the event, and/or inadequate clean-up of preserve following the event.
- 4. The sponsoring organization shall be responsible for working closely with the Executive Director of IHT in pre-event and post-event planning, as well as during the event. Responsibilities and expectations of both IHT and another organization shall be clearly defined (note special conditions and restrictions). Examples of these responsibilities and expectations are: site preparation, defining volunteer needs, addressing porta-potty needs, preparing for medical emergencies.

ISLAND HERITAGE TRUST PROPERTY General Use Policy

Be a "Leave No Trace" visitor!

- 1. Day use only. No camping.
- 2. Respect the wildlife. On islands, at Crockett Cove Woods, Barred Island and Scott's Landing please leave pets at home. Tennis, Pine Hill, Lily Pond, & Mariner's Park Leash only, Bowcat/Causeway Beach & Reach Beach Voice Control or Leash allowed year round, Shore Acres & Settlement Quarry 10/1-4/30 Voice Control, 5/1-9/30 Leash.
- 3. Trails are designed for foot traffic; no bicycles or horses, please.
- 4. Open fires are dangerous. Use cook stoves instead.
- 5. Be a "Leave No Trace" visitor: Carry out all rubbish your own and any you find.
- 6. We recommend a maximum group size of 12, with small groups of 6 or fewer most preferable. Groups larger than 12, please contact IHT for visitor coordination.
- 7. Be a "Leave No Trace" visitor: Please carry out all solid human waste and toilet paper; island soils are too fragile and shallow to bury it. Solid human waste left on the soil surface is a health hazard to humans and wildlife.
- 8. Leave what you find as it is (such as rocks, shells, sticks, mosses and other plants).
- 9. No motorized vehicle of any sort are permitted, except for emergency vehicles and property management purposes.
- 10. Hunting with care in season is permitted. During hunting season, all visitors should wear blaze orange.
- 11. Clamming and fishing are permitted.
- 12. If you notice another visitor in violation of this code, it is not necessary to confront the violator, but please try to identify him or her, note a license plate number if possible, and contact the IHT office.
