FRI. JULY 12 GEOLOGY WALK

9:30am Pine Hill Preserve

Enjoy a walk at Pine Hill on Little Deer Isle, with Roger Hooke, University of Maine geologist, and Paul Miller, IHT's Executive Director. Roger will unravel the geology of this site, while Paul will focus on the biology. The site is of great significance, particularly to botanists. The bedrock is peridotite with veinlets of serpentine, a form of igneous rock, consisting primarily of the minerals olivine and pyroxene. It is relatively rare to see peridotite at the surface, since it comes from Earth's mantle, a depth of over 30 km. It is the rock's unusual composition that allows distinctive plant communities to grow, making Pine Hill a very special place.


