Birder's Dinner & Presentation: The Curious Case of 3 Billion Lost Birds: Looking for Culprits in Northern Maine with Sage Levy St. Brendan the Navigator Episcopal Church 627 N Deer Isle Rd Deer Isle

6:45 PM - 7:45 PM The Curious Case of 3 Billion Lost Birds: Looking for Culprits in Northern Maine

Join Ecologist, Sage Levy, for an interactive and educational presentation exploring the harmful factors that have contributed to the loss of bird populations in Maine and across North America. Get an in-depth look at Sage's findings after studying bird habitat in the Maine North Woods.

Sage is an ecologist at Tufts University who works at the intersection of human histories of land, forest management, and bird conservation. Since 2020, they have been studying the effects of changing timberland ownership and management on bird habitat in the Maine North Woods, and exploring Maine bird population trends in the context of North American bird declines. They are also working with forest managers to guide ecologically sensitive harvest decisions, and the Appalachian Mountain Club and indigenous tribal representatives to build a lasting footprint of science and land history communication in the North Woods. In the long term, they hope to continue working on research and science communication in support of bird and land conservation in Northern New England. They are also a songwriter and drag artist, both of which are inevitably heavily bird-inspired.

10:00 AM - 2:30 PM Pelagics and Puffins Cruise 27 Seabreeze Ave, Stonington Take a trip with birders Bob and Sandi Duchesne and naturalist photographer, Sandra Mitchell through the archipelago to remote Seal Island National Wildlife Refuge, a nesting site for thousands of pelagics, puffins, arctic and common terns, great cormorants, razorbills, and murres. We may also spot gannets, Wilson's storm petrels, shearwaters, seals, dolphins, and possibly whales en route. While landing is not permitted, there will be many opportunities for viewing and photographing. Dress warmly for an open boat on the ocean. Depart from Isle au Haut Boat Services. Osprey's Echo Sea Kayaking is hosting a unique opportunity to appreciate the birds and other wildlife in the Stonington archipelago. Seeing the wildlife from the quiet and relaxing bow of a kayak can be a dreamlike opportunity to see bald eagles, osprey, guillemot, cormorant, and a number of other interesting natives, including local nesting habitats. In a kayak you can always get a unique and beautiful view! The odds of seeing one of our curious seals are also good, especially during their spring pup season. Osprey's Echo will be providing the services of an experienced kayak guide who has a deep knowledge of the area and history of our beautiful island.

- Tour will be a mellow paddle of the Webb Cove or the near area, highlights will be some of the known bird nest's in our area as well as other wildlife.
