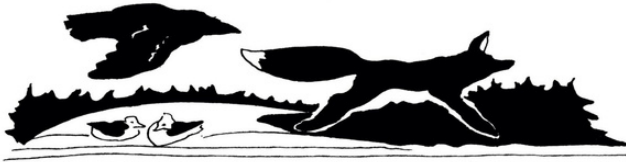

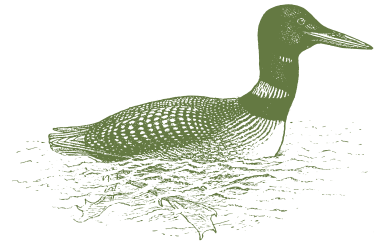

Rodenticide usage is becoming rampant and is having devastating effects on non-targeted avian and mammalian predators as well as pets. Heléna Melone and Jacquie Gage of the Rodenticide-Free Maine Coalition and Maine Audubon Policy Advocate Anthony Erwin will present the three classes of rodenticides, their usage, and symptoms to look for in both wildlife and pets poisonings. They will also discuss effective methods of Integrated Pest Management (IPM) — without the use of dangerous rodenticides.

5:00 - 6:00 PM Seabirds in Hot Water: How Ocean Heatwaves can Disrupt Seabird Breeding in Maine

Join Richard Harris Podolsky, PhD for a presentation on global challenges and local actions for protecting Maine Seabirds. Dr. Podolsky has contributed to the restoration of numerous seabird populations, including 15 years as senior field scientist for the National Audubon Society Project Puffin.

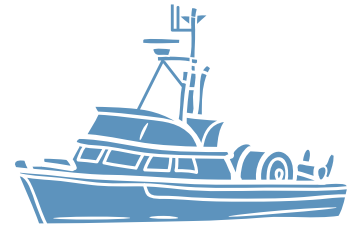
***This location has been hard for people to find in the past. Please check with an IHT Staff Member if you are unclear on where to go.**
